Meeting 1 – 2 times per week, the Instructor will help the consumer with their ISP objectives. These can range from creating and following a budget, to managing medical appointments, to healthy cooking, to assistance with navigating the Social Security Administration and benefits. TS Instructors help people learn skills in natural settings (i.e., the community and their home) and adapt tasks to fit their skill level. Every six months, the objectives are reviewed and updated.

Tailored Day Services

Since 2014

Tailored Day Service (TDS) is a unique, community-based day program that focuses on volunteerism, employment skills, higher learning, and community integration. Tailored Day is exactly that- it is a program that is tailored to the consumer's needs and wants. Programming is provided at a 1:1 ratio in the community. Staff will pick up the program participants from their homes, provide services, and then drop them off at the end of their appointment.

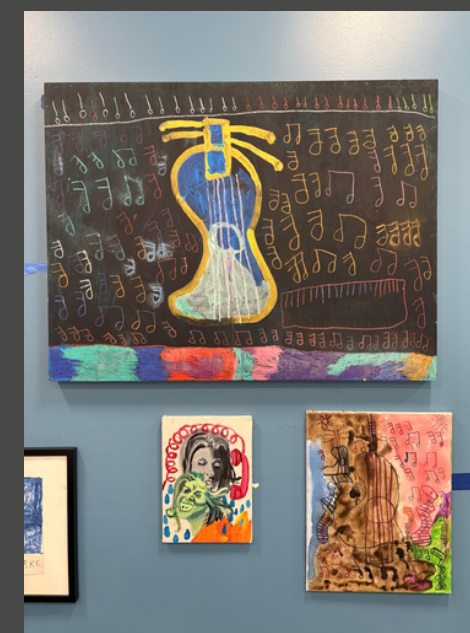

The ability to read makes a person independent. Without it, you can't sort your mail, figure out your bills, find bargains in ads, send a birthday card, a thank you note, or a complaint letter.

Many of our consumers at the Arc-Solano come to us with very limited or no ability to read or write. To help them, we formed a partnership with the Solano County Library adult literacy program to adapt their program to the needs and schedules of our clients. Currently, our Volunteer Literacy Coordinator and TDS participants provide literacy tutoring sessions.
